Design Details

For this assignment, you will find (or take) two photos of people modeling clothes (no lingerie or swimwear).

- A. Copy and paste each photo into this document.
 1. Download this document to your computer or device.
 2. Locate two suitable photos.
 - Download a photo, scan from a magazine, or photograph your model.
 3. **Save** your images to the device where you downloaded this document.
 4. **Insert** your images into the designated spaces below. To do this:
 - Click on the picture icon found in the center of the blue box. This will bring up the option to browse your device and insert the desired image.
 - Adjust the size of each image so you are able to fit your photograph on the page. You may adjust the size by clicking on the image then dragging any corner.
- B. Sketch each garment
 1. Make a pencil sketch of the garment. You can trace the garment outlines if you wish.
 2. Include the design lines of the garment. You may need to darken the important garment lines so they are visible.
 3. Scan or photograph your sketch.
 4. **Save** your sketch images to the device where you downloaded this document.
 5. **Insert** your images into the designated spaces below. To do this:
 - Click on the picture icon found in the center of the blue box. This will bring up the option to browse your device and insert the desired image.
 - Adjust the size of each image so you are able to fit your photograph on the page. You may adjust the size by clicking on the image then dragging any corner.
- C. For the photo, describe each type of garment the person is wearing.
 1. While you can mention the accessories, this is not necessary.
 2. The important part of the assignment is identifying the garment lines as exactly as you can. Instead of saying “high neckline” identify the specific collar (such as “turtleneck”).
- D. For the sketch, describe the design details for each garment
- E. Submit your assignment.

C. Describe each type of garment the model is wearing. This might include top, jacket, coat, dress, skirt, pants, etc.

She's wearing a sleeveless top covered by a sheer overcoat. A belt connects a checkered red, brown, and tan skirt to the outfit. She's wearing black boots.

B. Paste a sketch of the garment

D. Describe each design detail for each garment. Include a description of the collar, neckline, sleeves, etc.

She is wearing a sleeveless, velvet, sweetheart top, which is covered by a sheer, funnel, cropped article of clothing. Her skirt is tea length, patched, circle type of skirt. She wears platform go go boots.

B. Paste a sketch of the garment

C. Describe each type of garment the model is wearing. *This might include top, jacket, coat, dress, skirt, pants, etc.*

A long sleeved button up is covered by a corset/vest piece. A long, ankle length skirt hides heels.

D. Describe each design detail for each garment. *Include a description of the collar, neckline, sleeves, etc.*

Long sleeved, button up dress shirt with a bertha collar and an over shirt, tight fitted, acting as a vest cover the top part of this outfit. A maxi, decorative, flared skirt is the lower part of this outfit, matched with a set of black heels.



Part E. Submit the Assignment

After you added the images, your sketches, and written your descriptions, submit your work. Before submitting, save this assignment as a PDF.

The steps below describe how to do this.

1. With your Microsoft Word document open, click the **File** tab (top left of the screen).
2. **Save** your Word document.
3. Click the **File** tab again.
4. If you have the option to choose **Save as PDF**, select that option and continue to follow the instructions (you will skip step 7 below). If you don't have that option, choose **Save As**.
5. Select the location where you want the file saved.
6. Enter your desired file name. Recommended: Use the actual assignment name so you can readily find the file in the future. Include your name. Use hyphens or underscores to separate words. Example: If your name is Mary Smith, you might use the following to name the file: **W02-DesignDetails-Smith**
7. Change the file type by clicking the dropdown menu in the **Save as type** dropdown. Select **PDF** from the menu.
8. Select **Save**.

Return to I-Learn and submit the PDF to your instructor.
